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1. Summary

There are 8 levels of EQF Level and qualification. In Training Curriculum in Social Innovation and Entrepreneurship for people in diverse cultural and religious contexts through ACE we use the Level 4 which is for upper-secondary education obtained via dual certification or upper-secondary education geared towards further studies in higher education with vocational internship-minimum 6 months. Additionally, each unit of the curriculum have 15 hours.
